

RESOLUTION #2011-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF STANLEY, CUSTER COUNTY, IDAHO TO SUBMIT FOR APPROVAL TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF STANLEY ORDINANCE #56-D4.

WHEREAS, the Stanley City Council have held a public hearing according to the law, and have approved Ordinance #56-D4 for the collection of non-property taxes;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANLEY, CUSTER COUNTY, IDAHO:

That Ordinance #56-D4 be sent to the voters of the City of Stanley for approval with the following ballot language:

QUESTION: Shall the City Council of the City of Stanley adopt Ordinance No. 56-D4, which Ordinance shall extend the non-property general sales tax of two and one-half percent (2.5%) on all goods and services currently subject to Idaho State Sales tax, with the exception of "guided package sales", for another 5 (five) years? Guided package sales are defined in Ordinance No. 56-D4 as any sale which is otherwise taxable pursuant to I.C. 63-3601 et seq. but which consists of a package sale which includes the otherwise taxable sale (such as use of boats, bicycles, gear, meals, etc.) with the personal services of a licensed guide or outfitter, such as guided river trips, etc. Option Tax revenues supplement the City General Fund for the support of the community building, emergency services, law enforcement, road maintenance and improvement, direct costs to collect and enforce the tax, promotion for the city including community based organizations, park and other recreational facilities, special events, and matching funds for grants used to further the Stanley Comprehensive Plan.


YES, The City Council shall approve Ordinance No. 56-D4. (A "yes" vote will extend the existing 2.5% non-property tax on all goods and services currently subject to Idaho State Sales tax, with the exception of "guided package sales", from 2011 through 2016.)

NO, The City Council shall not approve Ordinance No. 56-D4. [A "no" vote does not extend the non-property general sales tax for another 5 (five) years and the tax will be rescinded.]

This Resolution shall be in full effect upon its adoption.
