

City of Stanley Council Meeting Minutes June 10, 2021

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Botti at 6:07 p.m.

AGENDA AMENDMENTS:

Council President Gadwa moves to amend the agenda per IC 74-204 C to have a discussion concerning the Pioneer Park grant with the Development Company. Councilmember Clegg seconds. All approve. Motion passes.

Although the agenda was amended, Council President Gadwa never discussed this agenda item.

MAYOR COMMENTS:

The Gem grant was awarded to the City of Stanley for \$20,000. Very exciting news! The Housing need analysis is being completed now. DC drilling already has it scheduled to drill the test wells on the 4-acre site off of Museum Drive. A Municipal well requires additional requirements and we are currently also working on those.

The Development Company is helping he City of Stanley with an infrastructure block grant application for Pioneer Park.

CONSENT AGENDA:

PIONEER PARK:

Camping request (total of 12 camp or RV trailers), for the astronomers for the Star Party on the weekend of July 9th and 10th, put on by the Boise Astronomical Society. Botti explained that the group likes to stay with their equipment, and they were unable to find any vacancies in any hotel rooms. This event is open to the public. Council President Gadwa moves to approve the camping request for the astronomers with the mayor designating where the group may camp in the park. Councilmember Cardoso seconds. All approve. Motion passes.

STREET AND ROADS:

Dust abatement will be applied by the City of Stanley in the parking lot on Wednesday the 16th. There are notices posted and there will be no parking permitted on this date.

AD HOC COMMITTEES:

<u>Sawtooth Interpretive & Historical Association:</u> Redfish center will open tomorrow. Recently they received the RAC grant. Bids will be coming in soon.

Snowmobile Groomer: Roof on groomer shed will be fixed soon.

<u>Chamber of Commerce:</u> Jeffrey Hall, the chamber just received two new chamber members and they now have a record number of businesses that have joined, 94 members' total. On Fridays they will have a naturalist working in the Chamber office. ITC Grant 2022 new proposal is completed, they increased the budget from \$80,000 to \$150,000. Sawtooth Festival is booking fast. Botti noted Brigham Young University has only received a total of 16 surveys back for the housing survey.

OLD BUSINESS:

Council President Gadwa passed out new wording for the Title 17 and she went through each change and the group discussed these changes. Gadwa stated if you agree with these discussion points, she would like to have a public hearing as soon as possible. It was agreed to set up a Public Hearing date for the General Use Regulation Title 17 zoning for July 8, 2021, at 5:00 p.m.

NEW BUISNESS:

Discuss forming an independent Task Force for elected officials' compensation. This came about after a budget meeting Jeffrey Hall with the Chamber of Commerce attended and due to the fact that this ordinance must be posted by the middle of August if this recommendation is acted upon for it to be effective for this election year. Council President Gadwa moves for Jeffrey Hall to form an evaluation of elected officials' compensation task force. Councilmember Cardoso seconds. All approve. Motion passes.



CITY CLERK REPORT:

The city clerk asked the city council if the council meeting for August could be changed, the mayor will not be available and is requesting we change it to anytime the week following the 12th. It was decided that the August Council meeting will be changed to August 17, 2021 @ 6:00 p.m., and the public hearing for the FY21-2022 Budget will still be on August 12, 2021.

Mayor Botti asked the City Clerk how we were doing on the funds with the American Rescue Plan Act by the Federal Government from the State of Idaho, she informed him that on 6/15/21 there is a conference call with the State of Idaho and that cities are not authorized to apply for funds until after this conference call.

Mayor Botti adjourns the meeting at 7:40 p.m.
