MAYOR COMMENTS:

We have been working diligently towards submitting a grant application to the State of Idaho Land & Conservation Fund to expand the Pioneer Park Ice Rink project. Unfortunately, it will not be feasible for the City of Stanley to come up with matching funds for this large project this year. The placement of the Ice Rink will also needs further attention prior to any submission.

COVID-19 UPDATE:

Amy Klingler is happy to report the surge in Stanley has decreased. Custer County has 11 active cases. There are 1,825 new cases in the State of Idaho today therefore it looks like we will be staying in Stage 2. For the second straight week Idaho is the 2nd highest State per capita with active cases. About 3,000 people a day are dying of COVID-19 nationally. Amy Klingler has already signed up to receive the vaccine as a healthcare worker, she is not concerned about complications from the vaccine.

<u>Sawtooth Interpretive & Historical Association</u>: will be working out of the Chamber office throughout the winter.

Groomer: The groomer is ready to go. In a recent groomer meeting Brian Dilenge reminded us that we need 18" of snow on the ground before starting any grooming. We completed corridor work on the snowmobile trail due to some surveying done by the Forest Service. For people snowmobiling between Stanley and Smiley Creek the Champion Creek Road is plowed for work, and they should be done plowing today. IDPR is looking seriously at replacing our groomer by 2022. Botti notified everyone that the Park Creek ski trails are now being groomed.

<u>Chamber of Commerce:</u> Jeffrey Hall is a new board member, there was a membership meeting yesterday, the current board members are: Josh Frank, Charlie Thompson, Jesse Thompson, Ashley Hadzor, Mandy Clark and Jeff Clegg. They updated and amended the By-laws. Eddie Bengston resigned last Monday, currently there is not an executive director or an office manager. The Winterfest committee met this morning, and they are developing a safety plan. A request will be presented to the City when it is decided if this event can be held this year. A new survey was just completed that included work force housing.

OLD BUSINESS:

Changes were made to the Personnel Policy 2020 that was already approved on 11-12-2020: due to the small roll over amount allowed in the new policy for the vacation benefits the City Clerk asked if in the first 5 months of each new fiscal year if it was possible for an employee to take vacation in this time frame if approved by the Mayor and or the City Council. Council President Gadwa stated this can absolutely be done and Mayor Botti agreed. Councilmember Clegg moves to approve the 2020 Personnel Policy with the changes. Councilmember Sentz seconds. All approve. Motion passes.

NEW BUSINESS:

Annexation of City of Stanley – 4 acres for work force housing. The building site is not within the City Limits, it is necessary to incorporate it within the City Limits once

buildings are built so we can manage this property. We will have to annex part of the Forest Service land and the County Road, there is no need to annex the museum. There are no private parcels that would be involved in this annexation. We simply want to get access to the City of Stanley property for the Work Force Housing project. Annexing this property will enable us to apply for grants, if we don't own the property, we would not be eligible for grants.

Public Health Emergency order and Local Disaster Declaration Resolution #2020-08: reauthorize and extend the emergency health order. President Gadwa would like to extend the Public Health order. Council President Gadwa moves to extend Local Disaster Declaration Resolution 2020-08 through January 9, 2021. Councilmember Sentz seconds. All approve. Motion passes. The Mayor will continue the Emergency Health order.

CITY CLERK REPORT:

Set up a tentative work session Tuesday, January 12, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. for the 4-acre annexation, Title 17, and rezoning of Valley Creek.

The suggested winter and summer meeting schedule for 2021: Winter Meetings will be at 5:00 p.m. Nov-April, Summer Meetings will be at 6:00 p.m. May – Oct. The City Council approved these new meeting hours.

The City Clerk notified the Council that the budget for FY20-21 will go over approximately \$1,000 for insurance benefits (at this time it is unclear how this will effect the budget for our retirement program) due to our new 2020 Personnel Policy.
