**OLD BUSINESS:**

Continue discussion about title 17 code changes to building appearance, materials, heights, and hillside construction requirement. Mayor Botti handed out a title 17 discussion concepts and changes to proposed ordinance changes to the city council, one of the big concerns are homes that look more modernistic than the more traditional type building, our code and comprehensive plan state rustic and western, people feel that some of the homes recently built are not rustic and western, but can still be construed within the code, it is in the eye of the beholder. By clarifying the wording in the code and making changes everyone would like to see this will help remedy any inconsistencies. Council President Gadwa would like the City Council to think about our discussion points tonight. Councilmember Cron agrees that all of these changes need to be considered. Clegg would like to see a survey go out to our agenda list to try and receive more public comments before we move further.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Resolution #2020-03 Establishing standards for face coverings and physical distancing. We are trying to avoid having businesses open and then having them close again. We are not seeing many residence and visitors wearing masks. It was decided to extend the effective date of the resolution thru September 31, 2020. Council President Gadwa thinks this a good first step, this is a recommendation at this point. Council President Gadwa moves to approve resolution 2020-03. Councilmember Sentz seconds. Roll Call Vote: Council




**CITY CLERK REPORT:**
