Town Hall Meeting - Traffic
July 20, 2023**

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Botti at 5:06 p.m.

TRAFFIC CONCERNS:

The main concerns of the group:


1. 25 mph speed limits on state highways within city boundaries. 25 mph speed limits will help businesses because people will slow down and notice businesses.
2. Need crosswalk between Mountain Village Merc and motel, across Highway 21 at Wall Street, across Highway 21 at Niece Avenue, and across Highway 75 at River One.
3. Consider rumble strips when entering town to alert motorists to change in speed limit
Need a way to alert motorists that crosswalks exist. Could have pedestrians carry flags as in Ketchum or could have pedestrians activate a flashing light.
4. Consider possible turn lanes into Niece Avenue, Wall Street, and City Building instead of extra driving lanes as is currently the case.
5. Consider circulating a petition to reduce speed limits and to construct crosswalks on Highway 21 and present it to ITD.
6. Need pedestrian/bike path from city center to Stanley Museum, and west to Stanley Lake turnoff. Could these paths be on ITD right-of-way?
7. Upgrade the pedestrian path from River One to Mountain Village.
8. Consider reducing the speed limit from 65 to 55 or 35 on Highway 21 from Stanley to Stanley Lake turnoff.
9. Consider reducing the speed limit on Highway 75 at Redfish Lake junction from 65 to 55 to allow more time for cars turning onto 75 to enter the highway.
10. Consider a speed limit sign each way on 75 near Redfish Lake turnoff because many cars do not know what the speed limit is and drive too slowly.

Everyone agreed that we need to address all these issues with ITD in the upcoming meeting. The hope is, is to have as many of them implemented as possible.

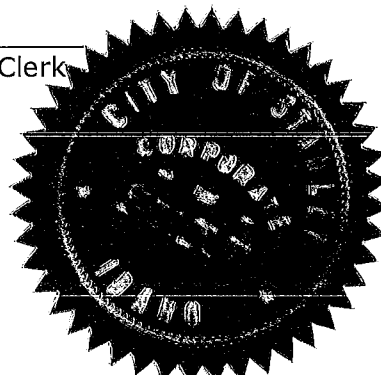
Mayor Botti adjourns the meeting at 5:40 p.m.
